

In 2018, the animal welfare community in Nashville reached a historic milestone: a 90% save rate of all shelter animals in Davidson County. Nashville now ranks among the most elite animal welfare communities in the United States, and we are so privileged that you joined us in this success. Spay/neuter and preventive veterinary care have been the keys to reducing the number of pets entering our community shelters, and your belief and investment in Pet Community Center's programs have made this life-saving achievement a reality.

And, as you might have guessed, we're not done yet. Now the most difficult work begins. In 2019, we will expand our focus beyond the animals that enter the shelter and begin working toward the goal of ensuring access to veterinary care for all pets in Nashville.

If you've lived in Nashville long enough you know that our community has a lot of cats! Whether they are indoor pets, outdoor roamers, or unowned strays, Nashvillians love cats.



Like many of our neighbors, Brian is an avid cat lover, but his feline family members have unusual living circumstances. Brian didn't adopt his eleven cats from a shelter or foster system. Instead, he became the caretaker of his small crew (eleven of the estimated 50,000 unowned cats in Davidson County) when they came to his doorstep, hungry, thirsty, and searching for care.

Brian loves all of his cats and makes sure each one has plenty of access to food, water, and shelter. He even built a covered porch off the back of his house where the cats can live comfortably. For the shyer members of his small family, Brian provides beds under his porch.

However, Brian knew that if he didn't spay/neuter his cats, his small tribe would soon become a full-blown village. Thankfully, PCC was there to help and spay/neuter his cats, ensuring that Brian can concentrate his resources on the care and health of his existing cats.

At PCC, we are lucky to meet cats at every stage of their lives. From newborn kittens to well-loved geriatrics, it is always so special to get a quick face scratch and purr from our feline friends!

2018 BY THE NUMBERS

In 2018, Nashville's community pet shelter, Metro Animal Care and Control (MACC), reported a dog and cat save rate of **90%**.

2018 GALA

Pet Community Center hosted the 11th Annual Art for Animals at The Factory at Franklin on Saturday, September 15, 2018 with over 300 guests in attendance. The event is our largest annual fundraiser with all proceeds benefiting PCC's animal-saving programs. In 2018 we raised nearly \$190,000 in donations through the event.

Chaired by Heather McBee and emceed by Suzanne Alexander, Art for Animals offered a live auction of exclusive artwork, a silent auction of local gifts and experiences, an open bar with a signature cocktail, seated dinner, and entertainment. The silent and live auctions included items such as: a week-long stay in a 2 bedroom villa at the esteemed Esperanza Resort in Cabo San Lucas; two tickets to an upcoming taping of CMT's Crossroads; and a 16"x20" framed giclee print of artist Elizabeth Brandon's Red Camellias.

We also honored lifelong animal advocate, Phran Galante, with The Jourdan Parenteau Excellence in Servce Award. This award honors a member of our community who has shown inspiring work and leadership in animal welfare.
