DETERRENTS:

- Apply cat repellant fragrancesorange or lemon peels, citrus spray, coffee, vinegar, tobacco, lavender, lemongrass, citronella, or eucalyptus.
- Use an ultrasonic cat repellent like CatStop™ or motion-activated water sprinkler like ScareCrow™ (www.contech-inc.com).
- Place plastic carpet runners spike up, chicken wire, latticework, pinecones, river rocks, or Cat ScatTM in soil in flower beds.

 Use a car cover to keep cats off your car.

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WHAT TO DO IF YOU FIND KITTENS:

- Stop and observe. The best place for kittens younger than eight weeks old is with their mother, if at all possible. Monitor the kittens for several hours to see if the mother cat is away hunting.
- Feral kittens can be trapped, spayed/neutered, and returned to their home territory.
- Friendly kittens can be adopted into loving homes after they are fixed.
